

## **Back Stories**

I call myself a local to the Sunshine Coast having a mother born in Cooroy and raised on a farm at Eumundi. She was the great granddaughter of one of the first pioneers to the area and the inaugural chairman of the Noosa Shire - James Duke. My father, even though born in NSW, grew up on a farm at Pinbarren (Kin Kin) and later lived in Pomona.

While I was still in my early childhood, my parents moved from Pomona to Brisbane for work, but later returned to the live at Yandina. I attended school at Nambour and after graduating Year 12 and having the option to attend teachers' college, decided a career as a police officer looked OK at the time.

A career as a cop back in 1977 seemed a good thing to do and I enjoyed the country roles in Gympie and the south Burnett. But I had itchy feet and was looking for some excitement, so in a complete turnaround, I radically changed my appearance and demeanor and then started associating with the less desirable members of our community, infiltrating the bikies and drug dealer's world.

One plus that came out of this posting was meeting a stunning tall blonde, the admin officer in the Drug Squad. After many hours, days, weeks and months of perseverance, she finally went out with me. Marriage, 3 children later and the rest is history.

My career progressed in various postings in the water police and other stations before finding my niche by becoming a Detective, serving in Brisbane, Far North Qld and the Anti-Corruption Commission. Again, looking for that little extra to spice things up I joined the Army Reserve, and decided to do officers training. I had a great time in the years that I served there.

A complete turnaround occurred when I was promoted to Inspector, and they sent me to head up the recruit training program at the police academy. A very stressful change but we managed to graduate about 1000 recruits in 2 years.

My zest for challenges never waned, so a transfer to Cairns and a District Inspector role eventuated. Managing the Cape and Torres Straits was very challenging but fit the bill nicely. Alas I wanted to step it up again, and an opportunity arose to be seconded to the Australian Federal Police and serve with the Regional Aid Mission in the Solomon Islands. This being most challenging and in 2006 I found myself commanding the police resources there. We ended up in the middle of a full-blown riot with the burning of buildings, cars and so many looters who did not care too much for our presence.

After my return home and back to mundane policing, you guessed it, what can I do now? An opportunity to serve with the "Intervention" in the Northern Territory arose. I jumped at it serving in the role of the Government Business Manager, coordinating government and non-government services into remote Indigenous communities.

This role led me then to leaving the police and entering the Australian Public Service in a Directors role with Indigenous Affairs. After a few years of challenging and rewarding work, I wanted more challenges, so I moved to Canberra where I took on the role of Director Investigations for the federal Anti-corruption Commission. Having had a brilliant career and missing the weather of Qld, retirement beckoned, and I headed home, settling back on the sunny coast not far from where I grew up.
