

## **Back Stories**

#### **ROSS PAINE's STORY**

I was born in 1941 and educated in the delightful Central West NSW farming town of Mudgee. Life was quiet as was the Paine family of 3 boys. Our family was heavily involved with the Methodist Church and we were no exception.

At the age of 15, I was accepted into the Commonwealth Bank to commence duties at Gulgong, NSW. Over the next 7 years I worked for the bank in Gilgandra, Lithgow and Oberon. I was then transferred to Bathurst in 1963 which started a new interest for me - Music.

I quickly became involved in the church choir, sang with local choral groups and musical productions and became a part of a very popular folk group, The Chesterfields.

In 1966 came the transfer that was to change my life considerably - to Kavieng, the main town on New Ireland in New Guinea. What a change and a time of experiences I will never forget. I was 1 of 10 male Aussies and I local from Manus Island stationed there. From my beautiful island the next move came 18 months later to Popondetta in Papua as the officer in charge of a 2-man branch there. After 3 years I was transferred back to Lithgow NSW. But who was working in that branch, but a gorgeous young blonde chick called Irene! We were soon married and then spent 4 happy years there where our first 2

children were born, before moving to Canberra for another 4 years, where Kate was born.

From the ACT we then went to Broken Hill and loved living out there. We were very quickly accepted into the local community and made lifelong friends from several people we met there.

Due to the death of my father and family needs, the bank moved me from Broken Hill to Gunnedah. After two years I was promoted to the Operations Manager back in Bathurst. After another 3 years we made a family move to Wollongong. Irene began working for the NAB bank and also became focused on her sewing and craft work, as she still does now.

I was the Operations Manager of Wollongong Branch with a staff of more than 100 and loved the job. My journey in the bank did not stop at Wollongong Branch as I was soon promoted to Manager Warrawong and retired from the bank in 1996 as the Manager at Engadine in the southern Sydney suburbs, after almost 40 years with the bank.

After a year spent setting into a new home in Wollongong, I established the first Mortgage Choice franchise in the Illawarra in 1997, selling it 5 years later to one of my employees.

In 2004 we decided to move to Queensland. Our two daughters now also live on the Sunshine Coast and our son still lives in Wollongong. We have 4 grandchildren and last year one of our grandchildren gave birth to our first great grandson and they now live just a block away from us here in the resort. After almost 4 years here in Paradise we are finally settled in our forever home. We love the friendships we have already formed. Irene is happy that the moves are now done with and she enjoys her participation in several groups.

During all these travels I managed to spend a great deal of time with service clubs, first joining Apex as an 18 year old at Oberon and also being a member of various Lions clubs on our travels - all up I have spent over 50 years serving my communities. I am a Life Member of Lions and 4 years ago I was honoured to receive the Order Of Australia Medal (OAM) from the Governor of Queensland for my services to Lions and particularly to a Lions Used Stamp Recycling project I started in 1991. This project has now raised in excess of \$350,000 for the Australian Lions Childrens Mobility Foundation to be used to purchase walking frames for children born with cerebral palsy. It is a project I am still very much involved with after almost 33 years.

In here, I started the 10c collection and the team have now raised over \$9,000 for the HOC.

Wouldn't it be so great if we could put ourselves in the dryer for 10 minutes and come out wrinkle free and three sizes smaller.
